About the Fund

The Public Sector Scholarship Fund is a tool for increasing public sector participation in the National Rural ITS (NRITS) Conference. Funds are disbursed in increments of \$500 to individuals who are attending the NRITS Conference for the first time and whose employing agency has not sent an attendee to the conference in the past year. Applicants must be public sector employees and must complete the below application to be considered. The number of scholarships awarded will be based, in part, on available funds. While all applications must be received by Friday, July 25, 2010, it is recommended that you apply early as funds will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis.
